Course Description

REL 231 studies religions of the world with attention to origin, history, and doctrine. The course focuses on Eastern Traditions, including Hinduism and Buddhism.

What is religion and how do different cultures define and express religious beliefs, values, and practices? This course examines these, and other, questions from a non-western perspective by introducing students to the fundamentals of several Eastern religious traditions including Hinduism, Jainism, Sikhism, Buddhism, Confucianism, Daoism, and Shinto.

- We examine the ancient roots and modern manifestations of each tradition by tracing the oral and written history and development of religious elements such as the holy, myth/sacred story, sacred texts, ritual, symbol systems, organizational patterns, ethics, and sacred communities.
- We study the impact of modernization and modern scholarship on the scriptures, customs, and beliefs of Eastern religious traditions.
- Additionally, the course explores and compares issues of social, cultural, and religious diversity that arise in the global context of our religiously pluralistic contemporary world.
