DNH 227 Revised: Fall 2016

Virginia Western Community College DNH 227 Public Health Dental Hygiene II

Prerequisites:

Successful completion of DNH 226.

Course Description:

Applies concepts of public health program planning through student directed community projects with an emphasis on preventive oral health education. Includes development of table clinics, bulletin boards, and volunteer service in the community.

DNH 227 is the lab component of DNH 226. Lecture material is delivered during the 1st three weeks of the semester via two-way audio and two-way video. Lecture material is reinforced and practiced for the remainder of the course via completion of the program plan, lesson plan, bulletin board and community service. The clinical component of the course is an opportunity for the student to demonstrate a working knowledge of lecture material. During the lab component of the course, students will interact with the instructor on a biweekly basis. (Additional description added by faculty member)
