Virginia Western Community College NUR 211 Second Level Nursing I

Prerequisites: NUR 112 and NUR 230. Corequisite(s): NUR 245 and NUR 247.

Pre/Corequisite(s): ENG 111.

Course Description:

Emphasizes complex nursing care of individuals, families and/or groups in various stages of development who are experiencing alterations related to their biopsychosocial needs. Uses all components of the nursing process with increasing degrees of skill. Includes math computation skills, basic computer instruction related to the delivery of nursing care; gastrointestinal, hepatic, cardiac/cardiovascular, oncological, and endocrine disorders. The complex nursing care is patient centered and evidence based. Provides supervised learning experience in college nursing laboratories and/or cooperating agencies.
