Explores fundamentals of creating web pages and site management with web editing software. Students will learn techniques of web page design as well as managing the resources required to author and maintain a web site.

This course provides an introduction to the WordPress CMS (Content Management System) along with a focus on content strategy

- Understand how domains and DNS allow website to be accessible
- Be able to choose a good domain name and select an appropriate web host
- Be able to install WordPress
- Understand what WordPress is and what it is good for
- Be able to manage content using WordPress, both for a blog or a web site
- Be able to create and manage categories for content
- Make appropriate selection of editors, browsers and ftp
- Appropriately use various image types and formats
- Describe the role of color and typography in web design
- Design layouts and determine appropriate navigation
- Work with WordPress themes, including finding and installing
- Understand how WordPress themes and templates work
- Be able to tweak, tune and customize a WordPress site
- Understand the different methods of adding content to a WordPress site
- Understand how WordPress implements image and video
- Be able to make the WordPress site mobile friendly
- Be able to update WordPress, themes, and plugins
- Be able to manage the WordPress database
- Understand the role of a CMS in web site design
