Students who complete the Virginia Placement Test (VPT)-English assessment with a score of 1 will enroll in ENF 1.

### **Course Description:**

<u>VCCS/VWCC Course Description</u>. Provides integrated reading and writing instruction for students who require extensive preparation to succeed in college-level English courses. Students will place into this course based on the VPT-English(Virginia Placement Test-English). Upon successful completion and faculty recommendation, students will move into ENF 3(if they require additional preparation) or into college-level English (if they require no additional preparation).

U	When a grade of U is assigned, he/she has either failed to attend class regularly or made little
	effort to complete the required assignments. A student who receives a U must re-enroll in ENF 1.
