Course Description:

Surveys history of Russia from earliest times to the present. Includes political, economic, multinational, social, and cultural aspects of Russian and Soviet history. Part I of II.

Upon completing HIS 241, the student will have gained a greater understanding of the influences that shaped early Russia. The student will have acquired an appreciation for the cornerstones of Russian culture and the individuals, forces, and events that gave rise to Kievan Rus, Muscovite Russia, and early Imperial Russia. HIS 241 will provide the "how, who, and whys" of Russia's formation.

Course Outcomes:

At the completion of this course, the student should be able to:

- Identify principal geographic features relative to Eurasia, Russia and adjoining territories.
- Understand what role Russia's geography and climate play in terms of future development.
- Identify important "Early Migrations" of non-Slavic peoples- pattern and cultures.
- Compare and contrast the several theories behind the Rise of the Kievan State.
- Understand the importance of Kievan Rus: Its economy, social institutions, and political structure.
- Appreciate the importance of Eastern Orthodoxy in Russia's development.
- Define and describe "Appanage" Russia.
- Analyze the effect that the Mongol invasion had upon Russia's development.
- Know the details of Muscovite Russia's formation, including key personalities and events.
- Comprehend the details of Muscovite Russia: Economy, Religion, Culture, and Sociopolitical institutions.
- Analyze the events surrounding the "Time of Troubles" and the rise of Imperial Russia.
- Gain familiarity with the "life and times" of imperial rulers like Peter the Great and Catherine the Great; understand the importance of their reigns.
- Appreciate the aspects of life in Eighteenth and early Nineteenth Century Russia.
- Be familiar with the reigns of Tsars Alexander I and Nicholas I.
