MUS 121 Music Appreciation I

COURSE OUTLINE

Prerequisites: None

Course Description:

Increases the variety and depth of the student's interest, knowledge, and involvement in music and related cultural activities. Acquaints the student with traditional and twentieth century music literature, emphasizing the relationship music has as an art form with man and society. Increases the student's awareness of the composers and performers of all eras through listening and concert experiences. Part I of II.

The student will explore various time periods and cultures, along with historical and societal references through instrumental and vocal music. The students will be introduced to a variety of musical compositions, forms, instruments, and composers of each historical era. The student will learn to identify musical works and instruments through listening experiences, while becoming acquainted with basic musical terminology. Music 121 covers the medieval period through the early nineteenth century.

MUS 121: Music Appreciation I

- 2. Demonstrate an understanding of the characteristics for the musical elements of each period such that he/she can place a musical piece in its proper time period.
- 3. Demonstrate a basic understanding of the history and visual art works that influenced each period of music.
- 4. Recognize key composers and demonstrate a basic understanding of their lives and how their experiences influenced their work.
- 5. Recognize major musical pieces, knowing the composer musical characteristics of each piece.
