Course Description:

Develops nursing skills in caring for both well and ill children in a variety of settings. Emphasizes theories of growth and development and the family as a unit. Lecture 2 hours. Laboratory 3 hours. Total 5 hours per week.

Semester Credits: 3 Lecture Hours: 2 Lab/Recitation Hours: 3

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Course Outcomes

At the completion of this course, the student should be able to:

1. Demonstrate the following: physical assessment, psychosocial assessment, and developmental assessment; and incorporate the findings in the management of nursing care for the child client.
2. Discuss and apply the steps of the nursing process as they relate to the management of nursing care for child health.
3. Determine the appropriate communication techniques and demonstrate usage in providing nursing care for children.
4. Utilize critical reasoning, role modeling, and creativity to meet the needs of children with diverse psychosocial, physical, and cultural backgrounds in a variety of settings.
5. Assume responsibility for expansion of knowledge base in the area of child health nursing.
6. Evaluate possible legal/ethical issues in the area of child nursing.
7. Understand cultural/social/economical and political influence that can impact the health and care provided to children.
