COURSE OUTLINE

Prerequisites:

Prerequisite(s): AST 101 or equivalent and experience in using a word processing package.

Course Description:

(Dual enrollment only) Introduces specific desktop publishing software. Teaches document layout and design, fonts, type styles, style sheets, and graphics. Lecture 3 hours per week.

Course Objective:

1st Semester

Students will begin to understand layout design principles and how to apply them in desktop published documents such as flyers, brochures, newsletters, and much more. Students will begin to assemble a professional portfolio that will contain samples of student work along with their resume and a cover letter. Emphasis will be placed on understanding and manipulating different electronic file formats within the Adobe Creative Suites 4 software package. Real world project work will be provided to help the students apply concepts they learn from class. Evaluation of work place readiness skills will take place through self-reflection activities.

2nd Semester

Students will understand the basic principles of web design as it relates to html, xhtml, java script, interactive media, and more. Students will be working with Adobe Dreamweaver to create their own personal web pages. At the end of the course students should have a basic understanding of how to manipulate Photoshop, Illustrator, Flash, Acrobat, and Dreamweaver to create a single project.
