COURSE OUTLINE

Prerequisites:

Course Description:

Focuses on the nursing care of adults experiencing changes along the health/illness continuum that are common, well-defined, and have predictable outcomes. Includes math computational skills, basic computer instruction related to the delivery of nursing care; acid-base balance, gastrointestinal, genitourinary, musculoskeletal, immunology, oncology, sensori-neural, infectious diseases, endocrine, respiratory and blood disorders and care of the dying client.

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Course Outcomes:

At the completion of this course, the student should be able to:

1. Understand and demonstrate principles of medication administration including dosage calculation.
2. Assess, plan, implement, and evaluate nursing care related to select nursing diagnoses involving: acid-base balance, gastrointestinal, genitourinary, musculoskeletal, immunology, oncology, sensori-neural, infectious diseases, endocrine, respiratory, and blood disorders.
3. Describe physiologic, psychological, spiritual, and cultural care of a dying patient and the family.
4. Understand and interpret common lab values along the health/illness continuum.
5. Perform basic nursing skills according to guidelines to meet client needs across the lifespan in the on-campus lab and in the clinical setting.
6. Report selected data verbally, in writing, and via electronic modalities.
