Course Outcomes:

At the completion of this course, the student should be able to:

- Understand vocabulary terms of the visual language and concepts
- Color theory
- Learn to think critically
- Demonstrate an understanding of line, contour, cross contour, hatching /cross hatching, implied line, value, scale, composition, positive/negative shapes, texture, balance, proportion and perspective
- Use the art elements of line, shape, value, and texture and color in their assignments
- Broaden their understanding of various media (tools) in completing exercises
- Demonstrate skill and confidence in drawing ability
- Learning through observation of objects in a two-dimensional and three-dimensional setting
- Constructing two-dimensional drawings
- Demonstrate the ability and skill with using the ruler and measurements

Topical Description:

Art 122 will develop basic drawing skills and understanding of the visual language through studio instruction and lecture. Introduces concepts such as proportion, space, perspective, tone (value), and composition as applied to still life, landscape, and the figure. Various drawing media will be explored. Color Theory will be explored.

The focus is on the five art elements using Prismacolor pencils and including the twelve colors of the color wheel: primary (3), secondary (3) and tertiary (6) = 12 colors of the color wheel. The five elements of art and design are Line, Shape, Value, Texture, and Color.

- 2. Still Life (use 2D hand-outs or 3D objects)
- 3. Figurative
- 4. Perspective
- 5. Conceptual (imagination)
