Prerequisites:

Students who complete the Virginia Placement Test (VPT)-English assessment with a score of 3 will

enroll in ENF 3.

Course Description:

VCCS/VWCC Course Description. Provides integrated reading and writing instruction for students who

require extensive preparation to succeed in college-level English courses. Students will place into this

course based on the VPT-English(Virginia Placement Test-English). Upon successful completion and

faculty recommendation, students will move into ENF 3(if they require additional preparation) or into

college-level English (if they require no additional preparation). At Virginia Western, students in ENF 3

will be co-enrolled in English 111.

Semester Credits: 2 Lecture Hours: 2

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Course Outcomes:

At the completion of this course, the student should be able to:

- Demonstrate the use of pre-reading, reading, and post-reading skills with college level texts
- Pre-write, draft, revise, edit, and proofread college-level texts
- Expand vocabulary by using various methods
- Demonstrate comprehension by identifying rhetorical strategies and applying them to collegelevel texts
- Analyze college-level texts for stated or implied main idea and major and minor supporting details
- Demonstrate critical thinking skills when reading and writing college-level texts
- Write well-developed, coherent, and unified college-level texts, including paragraphs and essays
- Identify, evaluate, integrate, and document sources properly

R	When a grade of R is awarded to a student, the student must re-enroll in both ENF 3 and English
	111. The grade of R indicates that a student has made satisfactory progress toward achieving the
	goals of both courses but still needs more time and practice to demonstrate proficiency for both
	ENF 3 and English 111 course credit.
U	When a grade of U is assigned, he/she has either failed to attend class regularly or made little
	effort to complete the required assignments. A student who receives a U must re-enroll in both
	ENF 3 and English 111.
