### Preparing for College English II

#### **Prerequisites**

Students who complete the Virginia Placement Test (VPT)-English assessment with a score of **2** will enroll in ENF 2.

#### **Course Description**

VCCS/VWCC Course Description. Provides integrated reading and writing instruction for students who require extensive preparation to succeed in college-level English courses. Students will place into this course based on the VPT-English (Virginia Placement Test-English). Upon successful completion and faculty recommendation, students will move into ENF 3 (if they require additional preparation) or into college-level English (if they require no additional preparation).

## Notes to Instructors

### Evaluation Policy

Students enrolled in ENF 2 do not receive traditional grades of A – F. Instead, they receive one of the following grades at the end of the semester:

<b>S</b>	When a grade of S is awarded to a student, an additional field will appear on the grade roster that will require a recommendation for either ENF 3/English 111 or English 111.
<b>R</b>	When a grade of R is awarded to a student, the student must re-enroll in ENF 2. The grade of R indicates that a student has made satisfactory progress toward achieving the goals of the course but still needs more time and practice to demonstrate proficiency for ENF 3/English 111 or English 111.
<b>U</b>	When a grade of U is assigned, he/she has either failed to attend class regularly or made little effort to complete the required assignments. A student who receives a U must re-enroll in ENF 2.
