Topical Description:

Class Days:

During class, student will prepare for First Aid and CPR certification by reviewing the history of the American Heart Association. Students will review terminology and techniques of providing First Aid. Student will learn proper First Aid techniques and perform these skills to show proficiency. Student will review terminology and techniques of CPR. Student will learn proper CPR techniques and perform these skills on a manikin to show proficiency.
