| 1 | Project \# 1 Mixing Gouache to create 12 Colors of the Color Wheel <br> Students will learn to mix gouache using the three primary colors: red, blue and <br> yellow to create secondary and tertiary colors. They will create the 12 colors of the <br> color wheel. |
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| 2 | Project \# 2 <br> Painting in Color with Gouache |
| 3 | Project \# 3 Color Wheel <br> The student will use the 12 colors of the color wheel (primary, secondary and <br> tertiary) and at least 3 tints and 3 shades of each color in their design. |
| 4 | Project \# 4 Illuminated Letter <br> The student will create a letter that relates to a specific COLOR |
| 5 | Project \# 5 Relief Sculpture <br> The student will create a design from an original drawing that shows linear or <br> atmospheric perspective |
| 6 | Project \# 6 <br> $3 D$ Book Design Project |
| 7 | Project \# 7 Chair Design <br> Students will design and construct and original chair, $1 / 4$ scale |
| 8 | Project \# 8 Money Design <br> Students will design a piece of currency |
| 9 | Project \# 9 <br> Bowling Team Logo Design |
