Course Description

Surveys history of Russia from earliest times to the present. Includes political, economic, multi-national, social, and cultural aspects of Russian and Soviet history. Part I of II.

The student will have acquired an appreciation for the cornerstones of Russian culture and the individuals, forces, and events that gave rise to Kievan Rus, Muscovite Russia, and early Imperial Russia. - Be familiar with the reigns of Tsars Alexander I and Nicholas I.
