- 1 -- 11" X 14" (1-24 sheet pad) Strathmore drawing pad 400 series

- 1 -- 1" square SOFT synthetic ended brush, also known as a flat brush
- 1 -- 1/2" SOFT square synthetic ended brush
- 2 -- round SOFT synthetic brushes #3, #6 or #8

- 2 -- palettes with compartments

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- 2 -- clean cups or jars
- Masking or blue painters tape
