- Discuss current issues and controversies impacting upon the profession of dental hygiene in Virginia and across the US.
- Identify personal values regarding the practice of dental hygiene and relate those values to a personal philosophy statement.
- Recognize rights and responsibilities of employees in the workplace as mandated by state and federal legislation.
- Prepare a resume and cover letter in preparation for entry into practice.
- Review the process and procedures for licensure eligibility via regional and state examinations.
