List strategies for communicating effectively with parents. 	
Managing the Learning Environment	 Differentiate between behavior, misbehavior, and discipline. Describe how to establish a classroom learning environment at the beginning of the school year to promote positive student behavior.

Positive Behavior Interventions for Schools and Classrooms	 Identify professionally-appropriate practices that promote positive redirection of behavior, development of social skills and of self-discipline. Describe positive behavior supports and interventions. Explain how to use language to positively reinforce student behavior. Describe how to effectively respond to minor misbehaviors.
Self-Regulation and Goal Setting	 Describe how to conduct an effective class meeting. Identify techniques to hold students accountable and promote self-discipline. Describe the steps for goal setting.
Instructional Planning to Promote Positive Behaviors	 Describe student academic needs that impact behavior. Analyze instructional strategies to increase student involvement. Explain how to incorporate cooperative learning into instruction. Create a differentiated lesson plan.
School Safety Plans	 Describe various school crisis management and safety plans.
